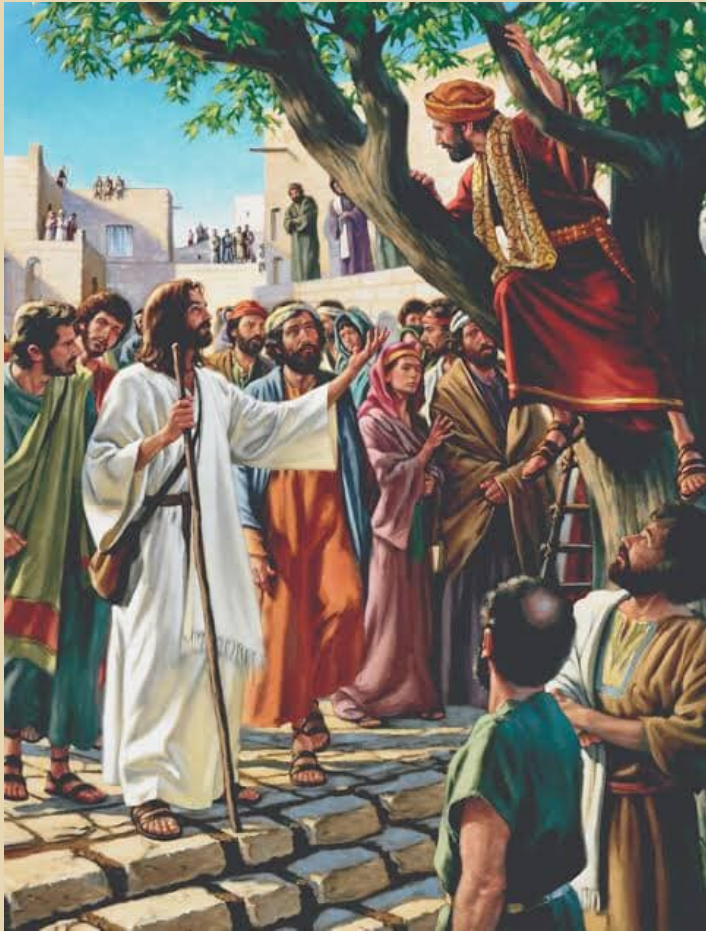

Reader A reading from the book of **Habakkuk**
